The curriculum provides students with a broad background in psychological theory and offers a variety of hands-on undergraduate research and internship opportunities in a variety of clinical settings.

Behavioral Health and Counseling Psychology Certificate

Psychology students are encouraged to complement their degree by earning a behavioral health and counseling psychology certificate.

Clinical and counseling psychologists help people with physical and mental health issues improve their wellbeing, reduce stress, and resolve crises. This certificate provides core competencies for students interested in pursuing a position in behavioral health and clinical or counseling psychology.
